## Preface to the Second Edition

Encouraged by the very positive response generated by the first edition of this anthology, we have made changes that we believe make this anthology even better. Although some essays from the original edition have been deleted, others have been added to increase the scope of our coverage of environmental philosophy.

To his environmental ethics section, J. Baird Callicott has added his important new essay about how environmental ethicists can respond to scientific challenges to the ecosystem paradigm. In addition to writing a new introduction to the deep ecology section, George Sessions has added an essay by Harold Glasser, an important new voice in the deep ecology movement. Karen J. Warren has provided a revised introduction to her section on ecofeminism. The most significant changes in the anthology have occurred in John Clark's section, now called political ecology. This entirely new section includes essays on free-market environmentalism, sustainable development, liberal environmentalism, socialist environmentalism, social ecology, bioregionalism, and ecotage.

My thanks go to all the associate editors for their ideas, hard work, and continuing participation. In particular, I would like to commend John Clark for having done such a fine job of redefining his section, which includes his original essay on social ecology.

On behalf of all the editors, I would like to thank the anonymous referees, who provided useful suggestions for improving the anthology, and Angela Stone, our editor at Prentice Hall, who supported us all the way.
